History: The Dublin Chamber Civic Foundation was given non profit status on January 13, 2007 (enclosed copy) for the purpose of scholarships to individuals in the Dublin community to further educational endeavors, to nurture young citizens who engage society through leadership service, to honor students and educators who exemplify the best of volunteerism, character, leadership, and a sense of caring and responsibility for others and to promote continued involvement in community service.

Project and Approach: If approved the Civic Foundation will honor the businesses that have located in Dublin. We would like to celebrate our corporate residents that call Dublin home in the July 4th parade for their contributions to Dublin. The 2 percent income tax that is paid by those that are employed in Dublin has allowed the City to develop the quality of life that we enjoy in this community. The Foundation would have art work designed and built by CCAD students that will represent the history of business in Dublin. The artwork would be completed before the parade so that it could be part of any display or exhibit that would enhance the Bicentennial. This artwork would share the rich history of businesses in Dublin with our residents young and old. After a public viewing of the artwork, the structures would be placed on a float for the 4th of July parade so that all of our community could enjoy the art work and the history.

Budget: The Dublin Chamber Civic Foundation is asking for a grant of \$4,000.00 to help fund the art work, the construction of a float and any items that would be needed for the Dublin businesses in the parade.

Goals and purpose: To create awareness of our dynamic business community. The Dublin Chamber of Commerce 35th anniversary and have Dublin business represented in the Bicentennial celebration.

Attendance: All who enjoy our parade.

Overnight Visitors: At this time we can not determine if any corporate residents will be coming to Dublin to join the celebration.

Promotion: The artwork may be displayed at the recreation center and throughout the community at any event that was associated with the bicentennial. The Chamber would promote the project via its newsletter, website and email marketing.

City Services: This project does not require any services.

Support: The Dublin Chamber Civic Foundation would cover cost of renting a truck to pull the float that will be used to display the artwork in the parade.

Future Support: There will not be a necessity for future support.

Maintenance Cost: None required

Coordination: Volunteer community business representatives will coordinate the project. This will be handled through the Civic Foundation

Evaluation: Increase awareness of the roll of the business community in Dublin, the Chamber's 35th anniversary and the Bicentennial.

Because our gross receipts are less than \$25,000.00 we are not required to file a 990 with the IRS.

Dear Applicant:


