Subject: Grant Request to Support the 2010 Dublin Art Fair

We are again requesting a bed-tax grant to assist putting on the 3<sup>rd</sup> annual Dublin Art Fair to be held July 2010. Last year we requested \$7,000 to help defray expenses and to promote the event. A copy of the follow-up report is attached.

With your approval, we would like to again increase the promotion and also upgrade the “look and feel” of the event. We wish to get away from the yard sale/county fair look and develop it into a classier event that Dublin can be proud of. Facilities have much to do with this such as eating and seating areas, rain protection, signage, visible help staff as well as quality music accompaniment. In order to do this we are requesting an additional \$3,800 over last year for a total of \$10,800.

The City of Dublin has been instrumental in the launching and maintenance of this event for which the Dublin Area Art League and the community are extremely grateful. It has been our intention long-term to reduce our reliance on city support and to make the event increasingly self-sufficient. However, the event has yet to achieve the status and attendance to allow us to significantly increase participation and sponsorship fees. Achieving this will require additional investment in organizational effort. We have approached several community organizations to seek partnerships but all are saddled with their own priorities and budget and manpower constraints so we will continue face this challenge. We would welcome discussions with community leaders as to the future of this fair.

#### **GOALS:**

- Bring attention to Dublin as a community that believes art is essential to every day life.
- Give the local artist community a chance to show and promote their work in a setting that is generally closed to them.
- Allow the public to interact with artists and learn more about the creative process.
- Bring people from outside of Dublin to enjoy this event and the shops and restaurants in the Bri-Hi District.
- To get other community organizations and non-profit groups to participate and promote their organizations

#### **ATTENDANCE:**

We are anticipating attendance at 4,000 minimum and as much as 7,500.

#### **OVERNIGHT VISITORS:**

We are opening the fair up to artists outside of central Ohio next year which we anticipate will generate some overnight stays.

#### **PROMOTION:**

- Dublin Area Art League is working closely with Dublin Community Relations.
- Posters, newspaper articles and the City of Dublin web-site and cable TV channel.
- Dublin Life has run feature articles and we anticipate they will again.
- Place the information on local radio stations schedule of events and hope to be mentioned on air as the event approaches.
- Contact all art leagues and arts groups in the greater Columbus area to inform their members of the event.
- Other community organizations spreading the word and gaining support through their memberships.

#### **CITY SERVICES:**

- Traffic control/assistance.

#### **APPROACH:**

We are again seeking permission to run this festival on the front lawn of Sells Middle School on Friday, July 16 from 3-9pm and on Saturday, July 17 from 12-8pm. We plan to set up four 20'x40' tents and have a different local art league fill a tent with their members. These tents go up on the proceeding Wednesday and come down on the following Monday and will not interfere with summer school or other activities. We are also inviting individual artists to set up their 10'x10' tents and display artwork.

This mix of established artists and large league tents should allow us to host over one hundred artists at this event.

We have invited other community groups to setup food and beverage stands for which we do not charge a fee so they can raise some funds from the event. This approach will encourage more community spirit and allow these groups to promote their organizations and gain community service hours. The intention of this festival is to promote community involvement in the arts and bring another activity to the Dublin historic district.

**SUPPORT:**

We have found the competition for volunteers to be very high. Those volunteers that do express interest are looking to do fund-raising for their own groups. We have found out that is common practice for events like this to make a donation to the charitable organizations being represented by the volunteers. As a result, we are adding a charitable donation line item to the fair budget in hopes of attracting more manpower for next year's festival.

**FUTURE SUPPORT:**

Dublin Area Art League envisions a Festival Board made up of volunteers from a variety of businesses and community organizations. We hope to make this a self sufficient community event at some point.

**LONG TERM MAINTENANCE COSTS:**

Dublin Area Art League anticipates no long term maintenance costs.

**COORDINATION:**

Dublin Area Art League has a volunteer committee in place to coordinate this event. We are relying heavily on the Dublin Community Relations staff and their expertise in running community events and will follow their recommendations to make this a successful event for everyone involved. We are recruiting volunteers to assist with promotional efforts and work the day of the event.

**EVALUATION:**

Dublin Area Art League will evaluate the success of this event based on surveys of the participating artists and random surveys of the public.

**FOLLOW UP:**

Dublin Area Art League will complete and submit a Grant Follow-up Report within 30 days after the event.

### **Dublin Area Art League**

We are a volunteer, non-profit organization without a P.O. Box or permanent location. DAAL has applied for and has received small grant amounts for funding programs that fall under Art in Public Places from the Dublin Arts Council. However, we are a self-sufficient entity in regard to our member programming and exhibitions. The Dublin Arts Council also has subsidized our rental fees to store our exhibition equipment. This equipment is used for our public shows and is one our means to raise funds through its rental to other organizations. We also offered it to our members at no charge to use for art shows and bazaars. We are not obligated to do anything in return by the Arts Council, but are always encouraged to promote art that reaches out to the community and other non-profit organizations.

**History, description and goals:** Since its inception in 1985, the Dublin Area Art League's membership has steadily grown and represents many varied talents and art enthusiasts. Our mission is to provide opportunities for area artists to share fellowship, information and educational opportunities. The group includes artists from beginners to professionals. While we have some full-time artists, the majority of our members work in other fields. We offer a convenient, friendly way for them to develop their talents, meet with other artists and keep an interest in creating visual arts. We meet once a month from September through May with a program or demonstration which are open to the public.

We host two juried shows a year, co-coordinate an "Art Stroll and Paint Out" in Historic Dublin during the summer with the Historic Dublin Business Association, and also encourage artist's participation in the new "Slainte Thursday" events during warmer weather. This year marks the fourth year we have hosted a Dublin Art Calendar contest which is open to the community and is sponsored by 12 Dublin Non-Profit clubs and organizations. It has culminated in an art calendar, sold as a fund-raiser.

### **Project Coordinators:**

Bev Goldie - Former DAAL President, present Chairperson of fundraising for the League, and founding chair of the Art Stroll and Calendar Contest/ Calendar. Bev will serve as one of the other chairs who will assist with promoting the event among the other

art leagues and artists in town. She will also assist with inviting some of the non-profit clubs and organizations she already has a relationship with from the Art Calendar Contest sponsorships to consider food concession booths and volunteering. Her qualifications include being a sole proprietor of a decorating business for 12 years, and an independent artist with local ties with community businesses. She has proven herself to be a responsible team player, able to motivate others to think big, work within a budget and reach goals.

Rich Sharick- Present liaison to the Historic Dublin Business Association, Coordinator of League Exhibitions, and co-chair of the Dublin Art Stroll/ Paint Out last year with Cynthia Bryden. Rich will be one of the logistic coordinators of the tents, volunteers, equipment, and logistics of loading and unloading materials and people the day of the event. His qualifications for this include being a free-lance professional photographer for events and seasoned festival artist. He has been involved first-hand in art festivals and has experience in knowing what works to make an event memorable. He has helped with the set up of equipment for his own shows as well as League shows. His past relationship with area business owners will help with coordinating a smooth event.

Cynthia Bryden – Present DAAL President will be one of the three chairs of this project. She will be the liaison and representative of our league for point decisions that involve the City of Dublin, the recommendations from the Dublin Art Council and the Historic Dublin Business Association. Her role as President of the Art League has solidified her knowledge of the local art community, and she has worked before with the Historic Dublin Business Association when she was co-chair of the Art Stroll and Paint-out last summer. She has spearheaded the coordination of Columbus artists to get involved in the Slainte Thursday events, and has in her own rights become known in the local arts community through her involvement and awards in several local, citywide and recently, national events.

## **FOLLOW-UP REPORT FOR 2009 DUBLIN ART FAIR**

### **ORGANIZATION:**

Dublin Area Art League

### **PROJECT:**

The Dublin Art Fair, "A Celebration of Local Art "

The Dublin Area Art League held its second annual art fair on the lawn of Sells Middle School this past July. The event was expanded to begin on Friday evening which by all accounts was a huge success. Perfect weather and a high quality musical act resulted in excellent attendance on Friday night. Intermittent showers on Saturday dampened attendance somewhat but the day was still a success. It is estimated that 4-5,000 people attended during the two days (a 2-3,000 increase over last year).

Revenues and expenses have only recently been concluded. The art league received a \$7,000 grant from the City of Dublin to help with expenses. While projected revenues were not achieved, adjustments were made to expenses to keep the budget in the black. A detailed budget/actual comparison is attached.

Manpower to put on this festival continues to be a challenge. The art league is still a small organization with very limited resources. Seeking volunteers from the community (both individuals and groups) to assist was fruitless. Student orgs are not interested in summer time activities and the community groups we spoke to are saddled with their own priorities and constraints. We were only able to corral a few friends to lend a hand with manning the festival.

However, we would like to recognize Jim Davis and his subordinates at the school. They were very accommodating. They ran electric, trimmed trees, prepped the lawn and moved construction equipment. Their assistance and cooperation was invaluable.

The approval of this grant specified that council member Amy Salay work with the art league and the Dublin Arts Council to increase interaction and participation between the two groups. A meeting was held on April 6 with Ms. Salay, David Giuon and Rich Sharick from the art league. In this meeting, Ms. Salay expressed the council's desire for the two groups to work together on this. Rich Sharick asked Mr. Giuon if they could lend any support/expertise/assistance with conducting and promoting the event. Mr. Giuon was happy to share examples of past festival budgets and promotional materials. However, he said budget constraints did not permit him to lend any type of manpower and/or marketing assistance. Mr. Sharick asked if they could send a promo piece to DAC members. Mr. Giuon said he could not permit this as the fair was not an official DAC event and their mailing list must be protected. No communication or interaction occurred between the two groups after this meeting.

Aside from the challenges mentioned, the fair was considered to be a big success and we have every intention of putting it on again in 2010. Thank you again for your support.

## Numerous upcoming art events are scheduled in Dublin

■ *Events start Saturday and will run throughout the month.*

Dublin celebrates all things Celtic with its Irish Festival in August, and the Memorial Tournament at Muirfield Village Golf Club is the city's official beginning of summer.

And July is the month that Dublin not only celebrates America's independence — it celebrates art and those who create it in the city.

The Dublin Area Art League is teaming up with the Historic Dublin Business Association to present the sixth annual Art Stroll from Saturday, July 11 through Aug. 1.

The three-week event will kickoff with the Plein Air Paint Out in Historic Dublin from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, July 11, art league president Cindy Bryden said.

Anyone can enter the contest that day for a \$10 fee, but must start their work by noon and complete their work for the day by 4 p.m.

Artists will start with blank canvases and submit their finished piece for judging at the Dublin branch of the Columbus Metropolitan Library, 75 N. High St. All pieces will be on display through Aug. 1.

Residents and visitors will have an opportunity to view the artwork of league members displayed in businesses throughout the district during the Art Stroll.

A brochure with map, featured artists and participating merchants will be available at the Dublin Chamber of Commerce, 129 S. High St., the Dublin Library, 75 N.

High St., as well as any of the participating merchants, according to information from the league.

"Sugar, Inc. Cupcakes and Tea Salon is new in the district and new to us," Bryden said, adding the shop specializes in organic cupcakes, teas and treats.

The shop is located at 36 N. High St.

Also new this year to the art stroll is Shade Photography teaming up with Elite Celebrations by Davin as an exhibitor of artwork.

"They are perfect together," Bryden said. "They (can) do something for everyone," she said, in the areas of photography and event planning.

Elite Celebrations by Davin is located at 22 N. High St.

The exhibit will be open during regular business hours through Aug. 1, according to information from the league

Visitors to the Bri-Hi district will have an opportunity to find their favorite artist while shopping and dining late as Slainte Thursday comes alive from 4 to 9 p.m. July 16 with special music, performances and other planned activities.

Artists are encouraged to come out and paint in the streets of Historic Dublin during Slainte Thursday

The arts activities will hit a crescendo at the second annual Dublin Art Fair.

Building upon the fair's 2008 success, the length of the fair has been extended from one day to two, from 6 to 9 p.m. July 17 and from noon to 8 p.m., July 18.

"We were really happy with the way the event went last year," Bryden said.

Because attendance increased Saturday as the sun went down, the league decided to make the fair a two-day event this year.

"Dublin is very laid-back on Sunday, as people tend to go to church, out to brunch and out to the concert," (Sundays at Scioto), "but on Friday and Saturday, they like to come out and party," Bryden said.

Because of construction activities at Indian Run Elementary School, this year, the event will be moved to the front lawn of

Sells Middle School, 150 W. Bridge St.

Members from the Lancaster Art League will join the Dublin Area Art League, the Bexley Art League, the Grove City Art League and the Worthington Art League, as well as 22 individual artists at

# Art fair expanded for second year

The Dublin Area Art League, which resurrected the city's art fair last year, has added a second day for the event's return engagement.

The Dublin Art Fair will be held from 6 to 9 p.m. Friday, July 17, and noon to 8 p.m. Saturday, July 18, at Sells Middle School, 150 W. Bridge St. Admission and parking are free. Food vendors will be on-site and a bike corral will be available. Artwork ranging in price from \$10 to several hundred dollars will be for sale.

Rich Sharick and Bev Goldie are chairing the second year of the event, which the art league resurrected after a short absence.

"The city and arts council used to run an art and music festival," Sharick said. "A couple of years ago due to various circumstances, they discontinued that and we went for two years without an art fair in Dublin. After two years several of us in the Dublin Art League banded together and decided to do an art fair."

The inaugural year featured more than 80 artists for one day at Indian Run Elementary.

Sharick estimated it drew 1,500 to 2,000 people. This year, the group is expecting more because of the extra day.

"We're expecting 2,000 to 3,000 people over the two days," he said.

On Saturday, visitors can peruse works from local art leagues to the music of groups including Blue Level, Dave Freedy and Joey Hendrickson.

Local singer and songwriter Jared Mahone will perform at 7 p.m. Friday. "We brought in a headlining band on Friday

evening," Sharick said. "He's a local, up and coming artist. He does groove and funk rock. I think it'll draw in a lot of people and make for a fun atmosphere."

Sharick said artists from the Dublin, Bexley, Grove City, Lancaster and Worthington art leagues are participating, along with 25 local, independent artists.

"We're trying to highlight home-grown art a little more," he said.

A few jewelry and crafts booths also will be available, but Sharick said work at the Dublin Art Fair will focus more on two-dimensional pieces such as paintings, drawings and photography.

"Because we are an artists' group with a lot of painters, we wanted to keep the festival focused on fine art," Sharick said.

According to Sharick, the event is not a fundraiser, rather a community event that gives members a chance to show their work.

The Dublin Area Art League is a nonprofit organization established in 1985. It consists of about 50 local artists.

# Artists prepare for annual Art Fair

The Dublin Area Art League is gearing up for its 2nd annual Art Fair, July 17 and 18 on the lawn of Sells Middle School, 150 W. Bridge St.

This year the Dublin Art Fair will feature professional and amateur artists from the Lancaster, Dublin, Worthington, Bexley and Grove City art leagues, as well as 25 independent artists.

"We decided to do the fair a little different and make it all about Central Ohio artists and art leagues," says Rich Sharick, event chairman.

According to Sharick, the art fair is an important event for Dublin resi-

dents, artists and the city.


"It's important because Dublin is known as an arts-friendly/arts-rich town," he says. "Without the presence of a festival like this, it would leave a void in Dublin."
