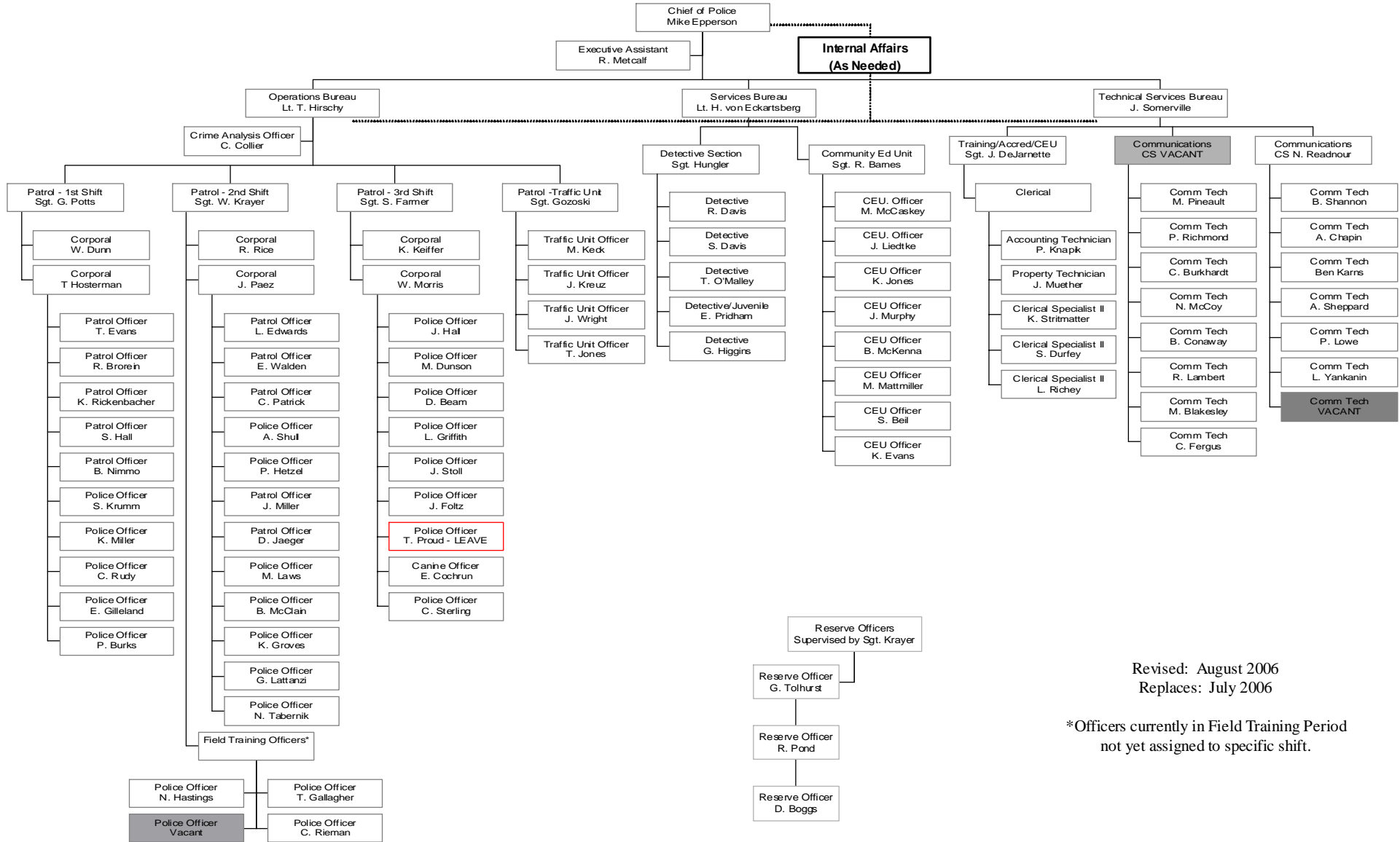

DIVISION ACTIVITY

CALLS FOR SERVICE

District 1

Includes all areas within the city limits that are south and east of Interstate 270 and west of the Scioto River. Also includes I270 northbound from US 33 westbound ramp up to Sawmill Road.

District 2

Includes all areas within the city limits that are east of the Scioto River, west of Sawmill Road, south of the Delaware County Line and north of Martin Road. Also includes I270 westbound from Sawmill Road to US 33 and the ramp from I270 southbound to US 33 westbound.

District 3

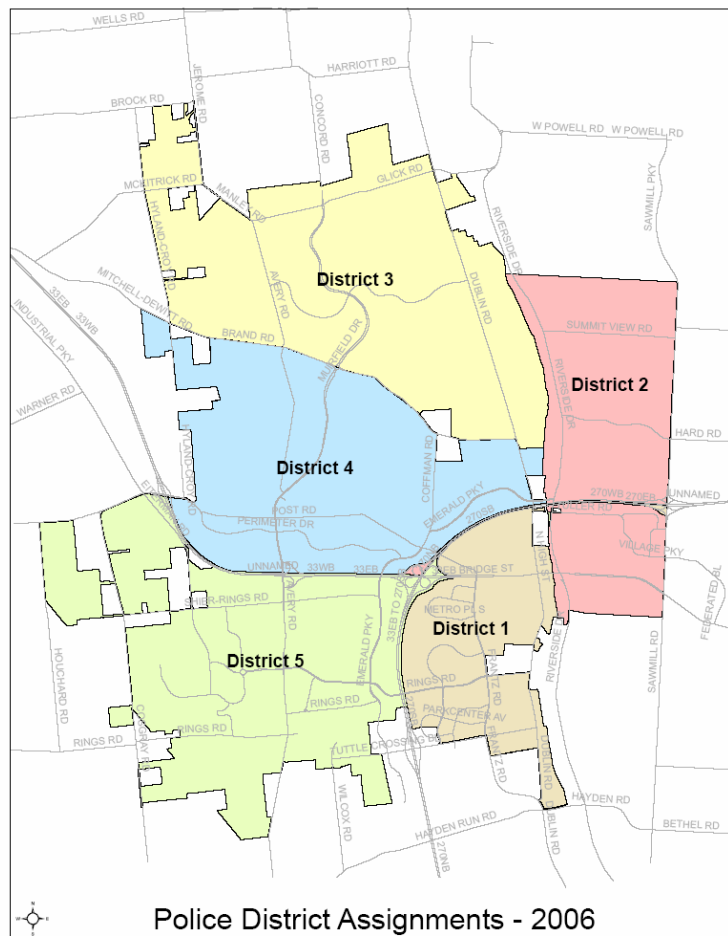
Includes all areas within the city limits that are north of Brand Road and west of the Scioto River. All addresses that are within the city limits on Brand Road including the intersections of Brand Road/Muirfield Drive and Brand Road/Dublin Road are covered by this district.

District 4

This district includes all areas within the city limits that are south of Brand Road, north of US 33 and west of Interstate I270, Browning Court and Dublin Road. Addresses that are south of Brand Road to the I270 overpass that are within the city limits are part of District 4.

District 5

This area includes all areas within the city limits that are south of the north edge of US 33 and west of I270. This area also covers both northbound and southbound lanes of I270 between Tuttle Crossing and US 33 and all ramps to and from I270 south of US 33.



NOTE: The following is a breakdown of calls for service. They represent initial reports. The number of actual offenses may be different after officer's investigation.

WORKLOAD ANALYSIS REPORT

July – September 2006

The July through September 2006 Workload Analysis Report reflects a total of 6,654 calls for service. This figure does not include traffic stops, foot patrols or courtesy cards initiated by officers or activity occurring in District 0 (calls outside city limits/mutual aid). The average response time for calls was five (5) minutes from the time the call was received by our communications technician until the first responding officer arrived on the scene. The average time to reach a disposition and clear the call was twenty-one (21) minutes.

The Workload Analysis Report also allows us to track activity levels by hour by day. We analyze this data to determine our staffing levels for patrol shifts. By reviewing our Workload Analysis Chart on the following page, you can see that our busiest hour of activity was between 3:00 PM and 4:00 PM. Seven hundred seventeen (717) calls for service were received during this time frame. The next busiest hour was between 4:00 PM and 5:00 PM when 613 calls for service were received. The ability to obtain this type of data is critical to effectively staff our patrol shifts.

While reviewing this report it is important to note that various factors can influence average response times. "Stacking" of calls where lower priority calls are held so that calls of a more urgent nature can be dispatched and responded to commonly occurs. "Cross dispatching" where an officer is dispatched out of district to a call will also increase response time. Low priority calls that are received during roll call/shift change negate an immediate response from patrol officers thus increasing response times.

As a matter of practice, we like to keep our average response time for all calls occurring inside the City under ten (10) minutes. As previously stated, there are certain incidents where that becomes impossible. However, our goal is realistic and as demonstrated by the July through September 2006 report was met. In an effort to assist the reader in reviewing the Workload Analysis Report the following is a list of some relevant interpretations for review.

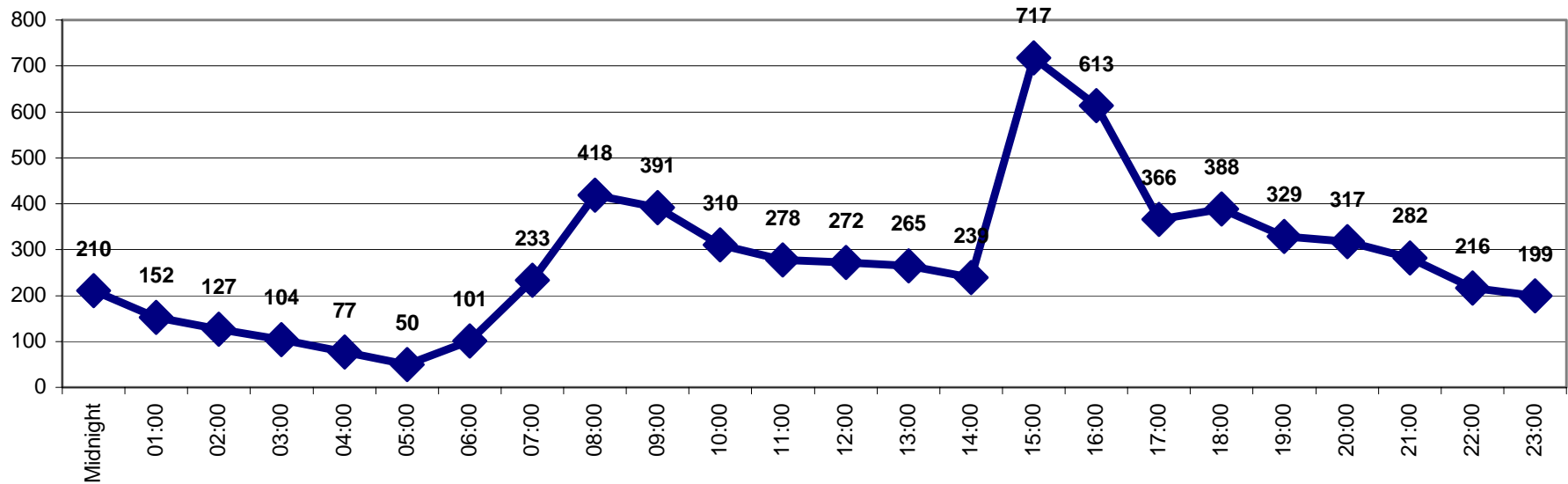

Calls for Service by Time of Day July - September 2006



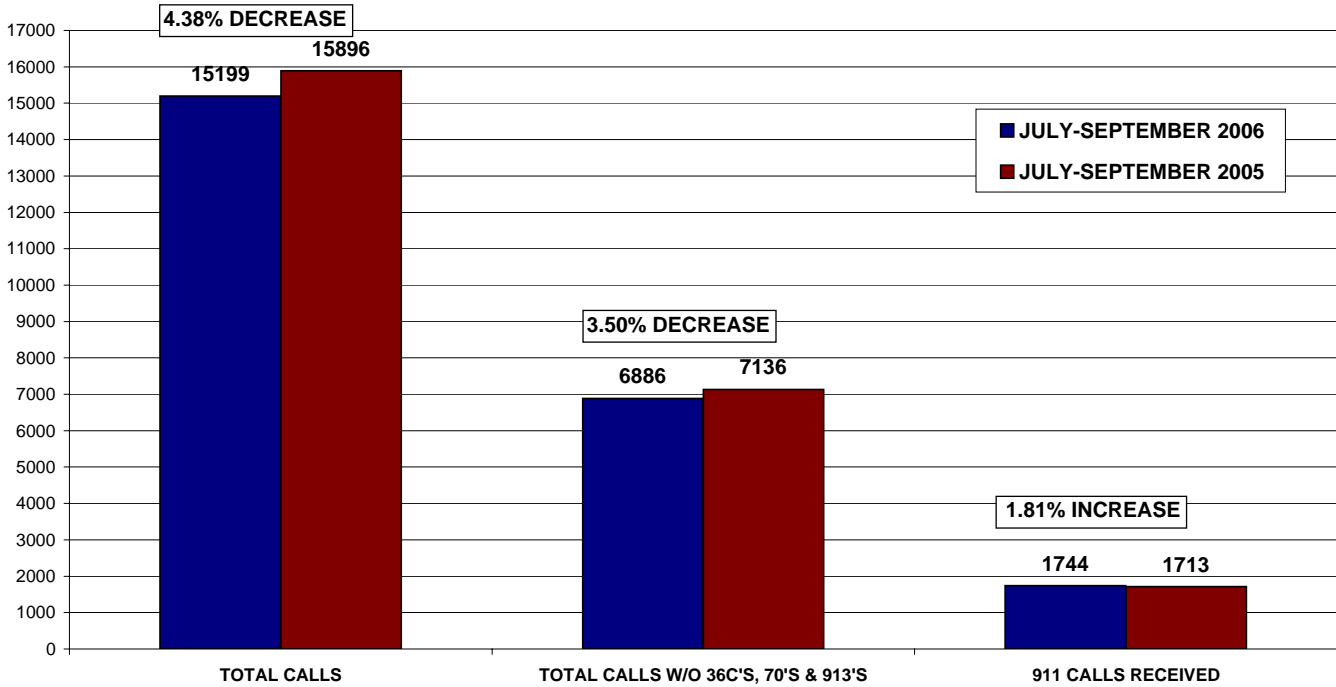

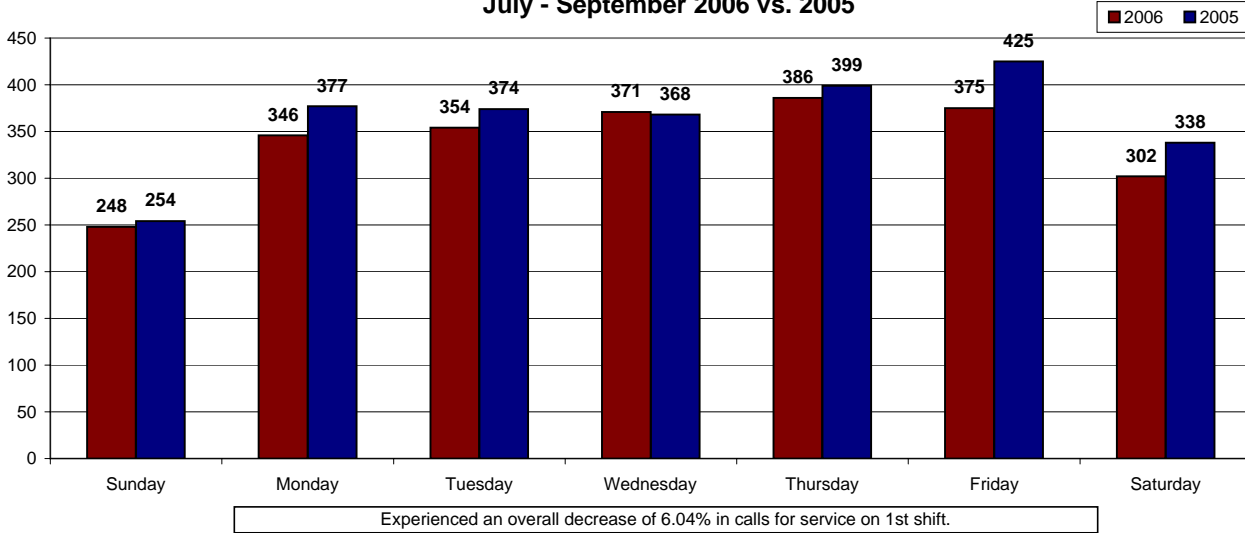

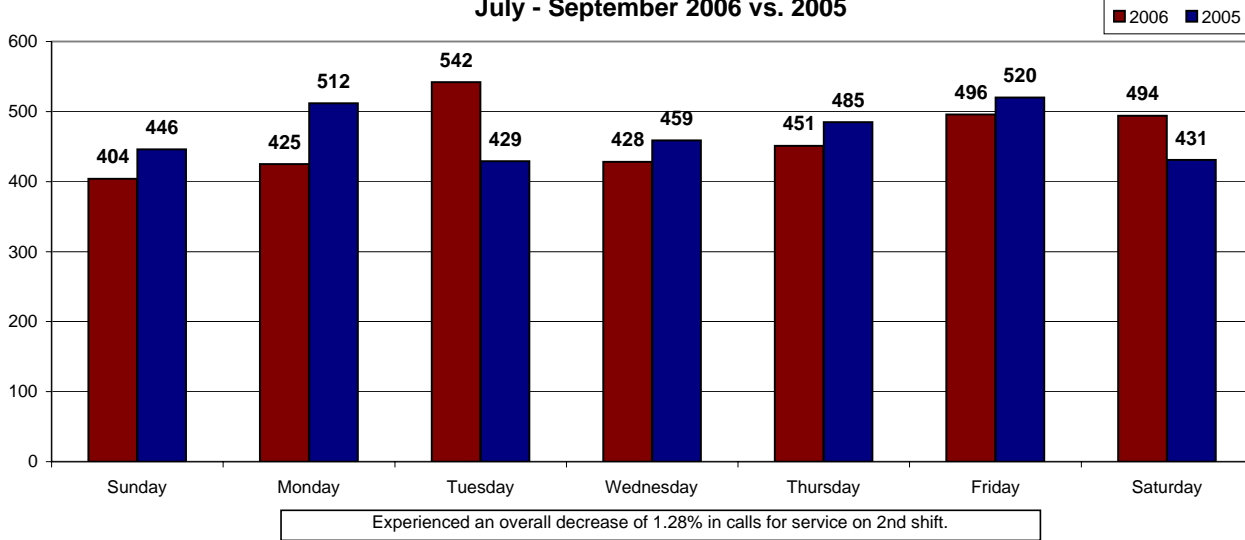

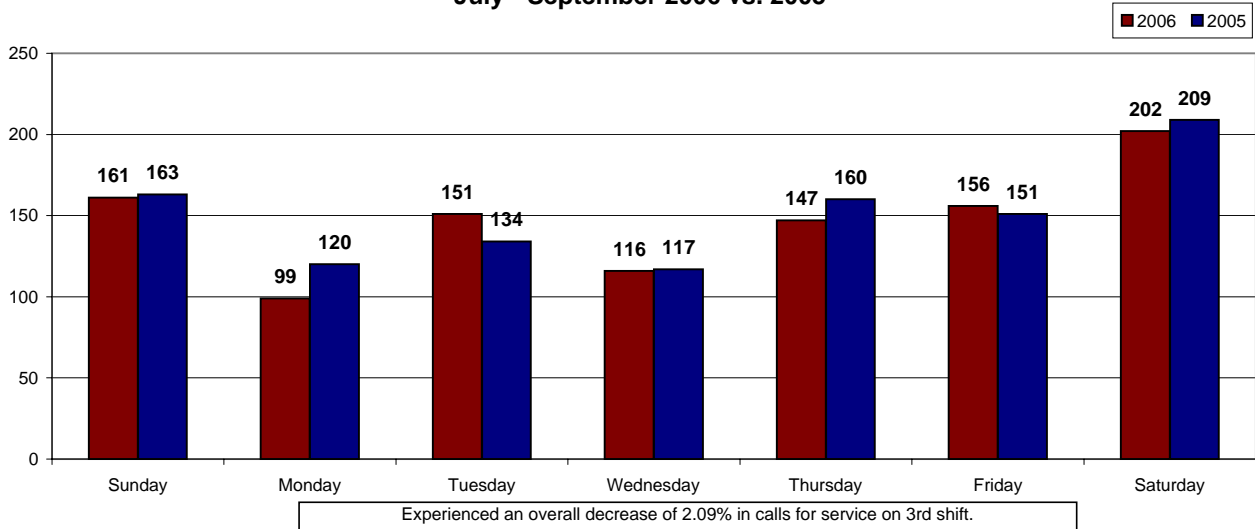
**Calls for Service - First Shift

**ACCIDENT ANALYSIS
JULY - SEPTEMBER 2006**

July 1, 2006 through September 30, 2006 there were 212 reported traffic accidents, resulting in an average 2.30 accidents/day. Compared to 2005, accidents increased 15% for the reporting period (2006 = 212; 2005 = 185).

Personal injury accidents (67) accounted for 32% of the total; one which was a fatality. Property damage accidents accounted for the majority of our activity with 131 reports being filed (62%). Private property collisions accounted for 14 (7%) reports being filed.

District 2 experienced the majority of accidents (61 or 29%). The second district with the most activity was District 1 (52 accidents or 25%). There were 10 collisions in District 3 (5%), 38 collisions in District 4 (18%) and in District 5, 51 accidents (24%). The busiest day of the week for accident activity for the reporting period was Tuesday with 50 accidents (24%) reported. The second busiest day was Monday with 42 accidents (20%) reported. Accident activity for the remaining days of the week were as follows: Sunday = 8 (4%); Wednesday = 26 (12%); Thursday = 37 (17%); Friday = 30 (14%); and Saturday = 19 (9%).

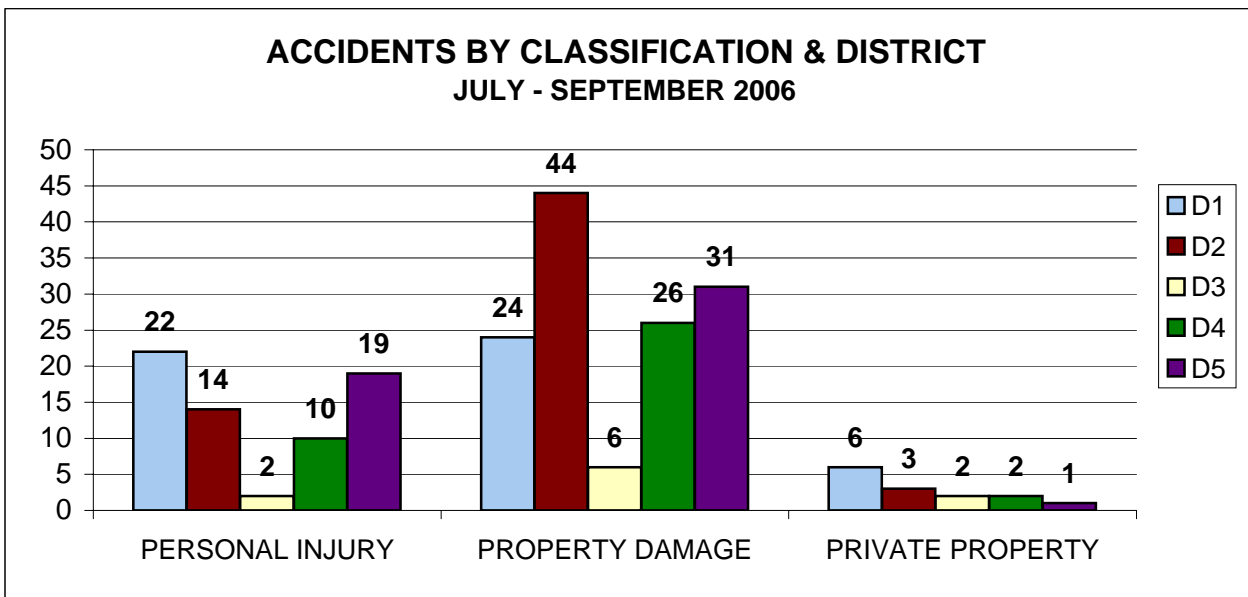
The most frequent contributing factor was Following Too Closely, which accounted for 77 or 36% of the accidents. The next most recurrent contributing factor was Failure to Control accounting for 34 or 16% of the accidents for the reporting period. The busiest time of day for accident activity was between 7AM-8AM with 22 (10%) accidents.

Four (4) crashes were identified as having been alcohol related (2%). The drivers in these accidents were arrested and charged with OVI. One hundred forty-eight (148) citations were issued to at fault drivers as a result of their accidents (70%).

ACCIDENTS BY DISTRICT & CLASSIFICATION

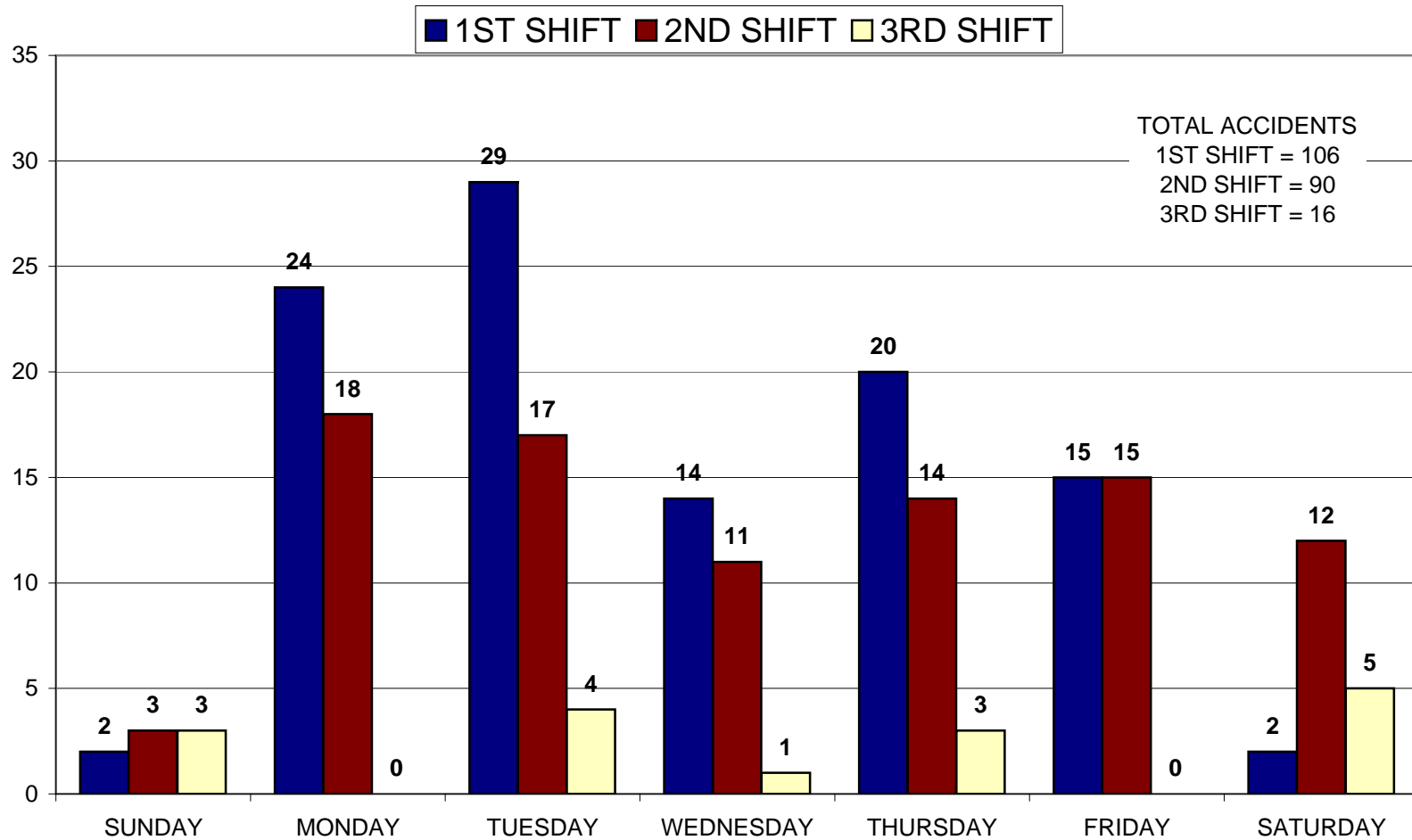

ACCIDENTS BY DAY OF WEEK & SHIFT

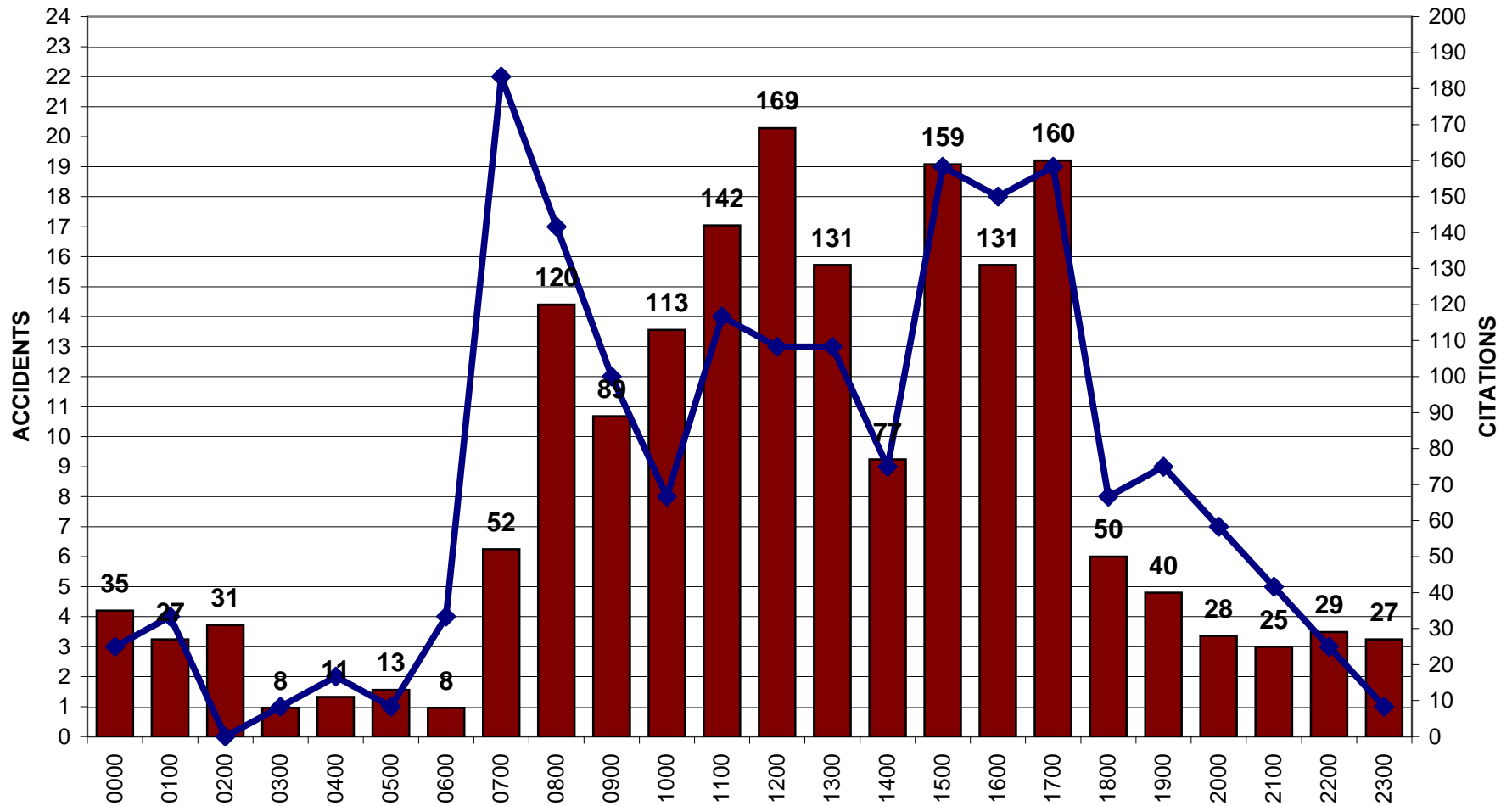

CITATIONS ACCIDENTS



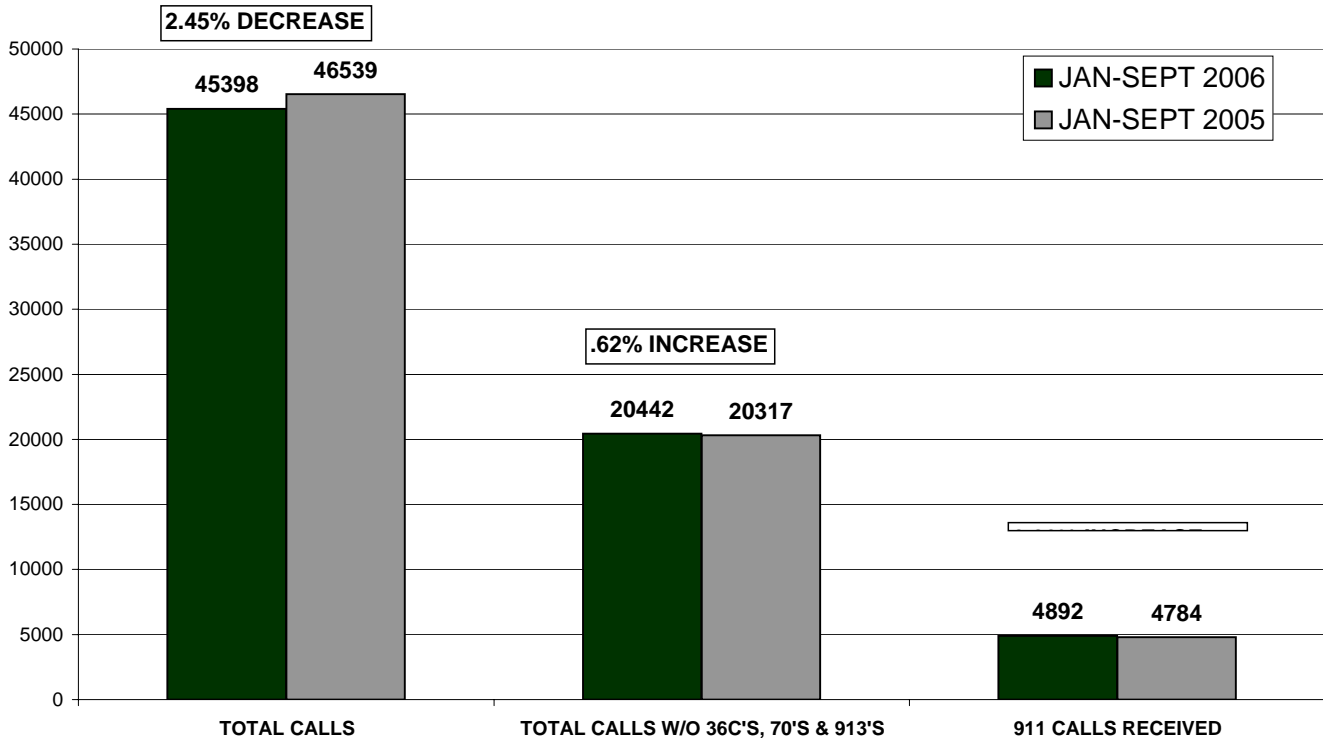

CALLS FOR SERVICE BY SHIFT BY DAY OF WEEK

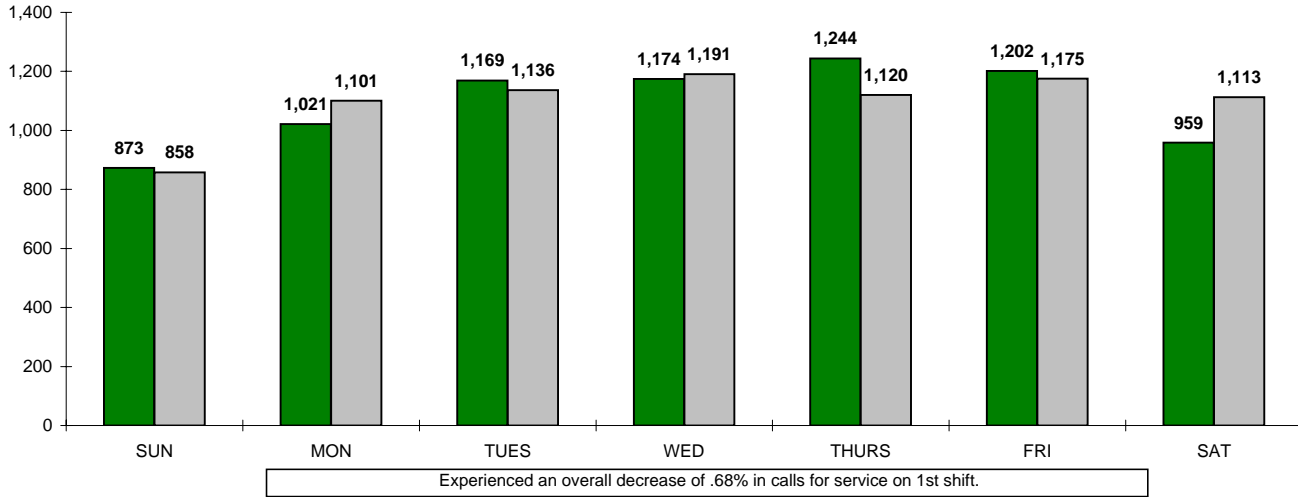

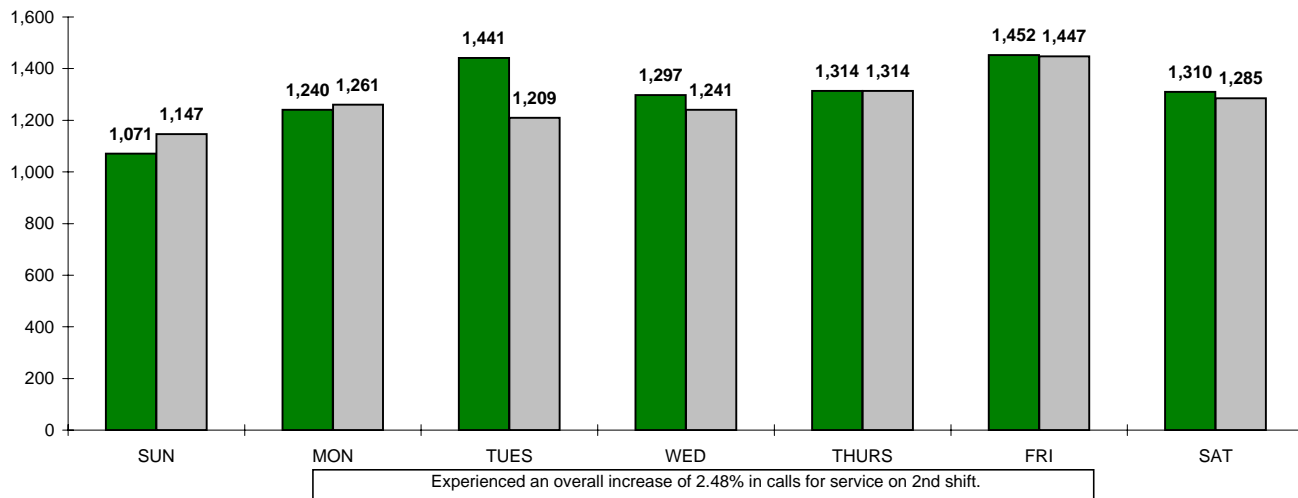

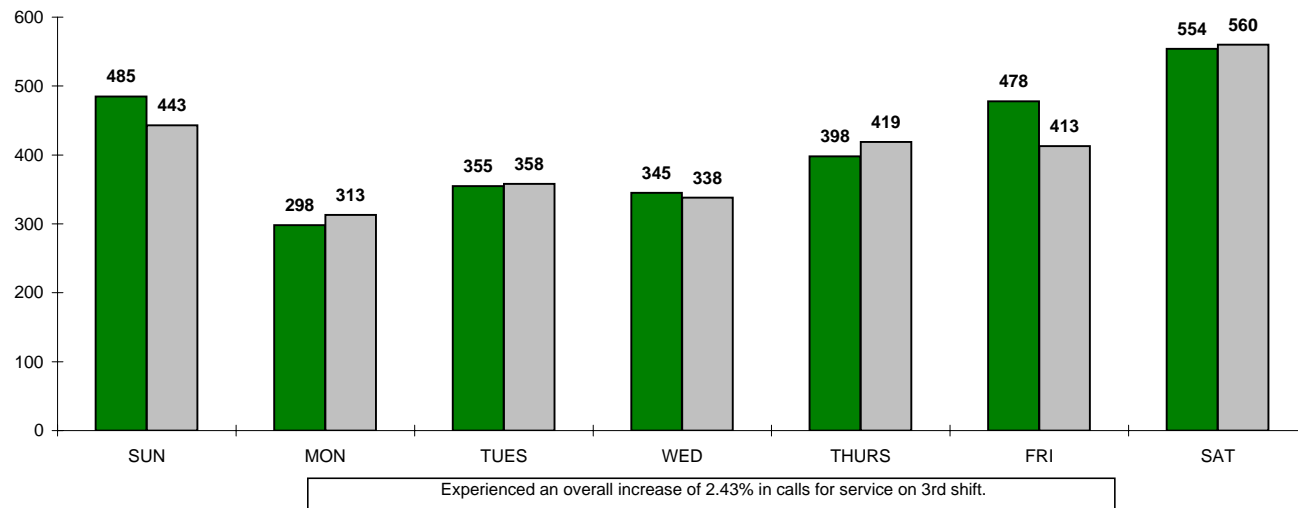
CALLS FOR SERVICE - FIRST SHIFT

**ACCIDENT ANALYSIS
JANUARY - SEPTEMBER 2006**

January 1, 2006 through September 30, 2006 there were 574 reported traffic accidents, resulting in an average 2.10% accidents/day. Compared to 2005, accidents increased 4% (2006 = 574; 2005 = 553).

Personal injury accidents (160) accounted for 28% of the total. Property damage accidents accounted for the majority of our activity with 348 reports being filed (61%). Private property collisions accounted for 66 (11%) reports being filed.

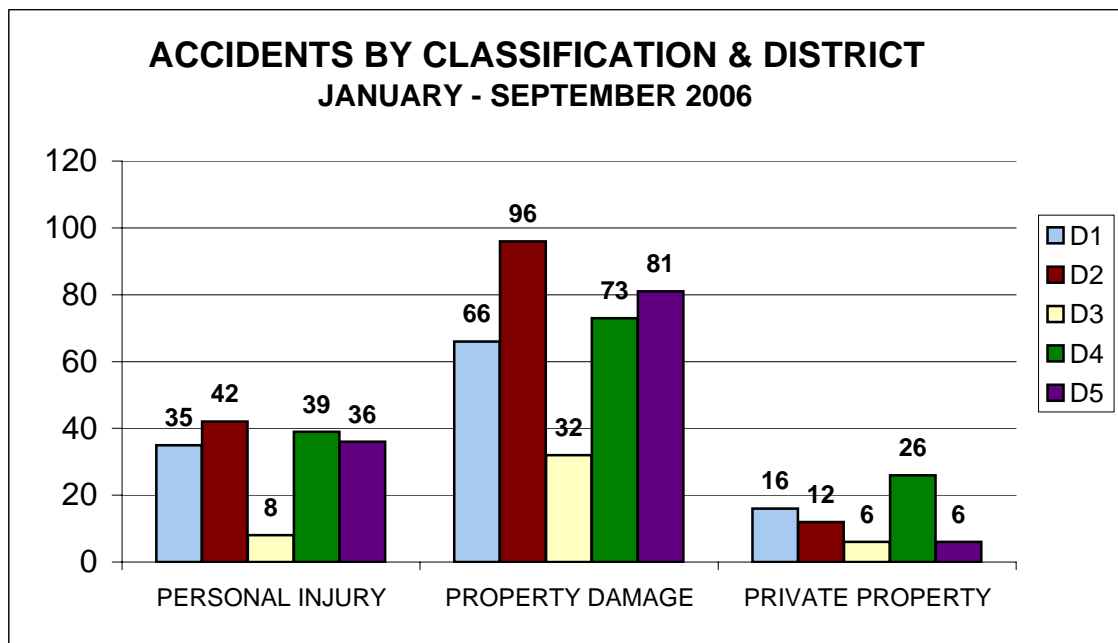
District 2 experienced the majority of accidents (150 or 26%). The second district with the most activity was District 4 (138 accidents or 24%). There were 117 collisions in District 1 (20%), 46 collisions in District 3 (8%) and in District 5, 123 accidents (21%). The busiest day of the week for accident activity for the reporting period was Tuesday with accidents 106 (18%) reported. The second busiest day was Thursday with 102 accidents (18%) reported. Accident activity for the remaining days of the week were as follows: Sunday = 35 (6%); Monday = 82 (14%); Wednesday = 95 (17%); Friday = 93 (18%); and Saturday = 61 (11%).

The most frequent contributing factor was Following Too Closely, which accounted for 186 or 32% of the accidents. The next most recurrent contributing factor was Failure to Control accounting for 89 or 16% of the accidents for the reporting period. The busiest time of day for accident activity was between 5PM - 6PM with 59 (10%) accidents.

Twelve (12) crashes were identified as having been alcohol related (2%). The drivers in these accidents were arrested and charged with OVI. Four hundred three (403) citations were issued to at fault drivers as a result of their accidents (70%).

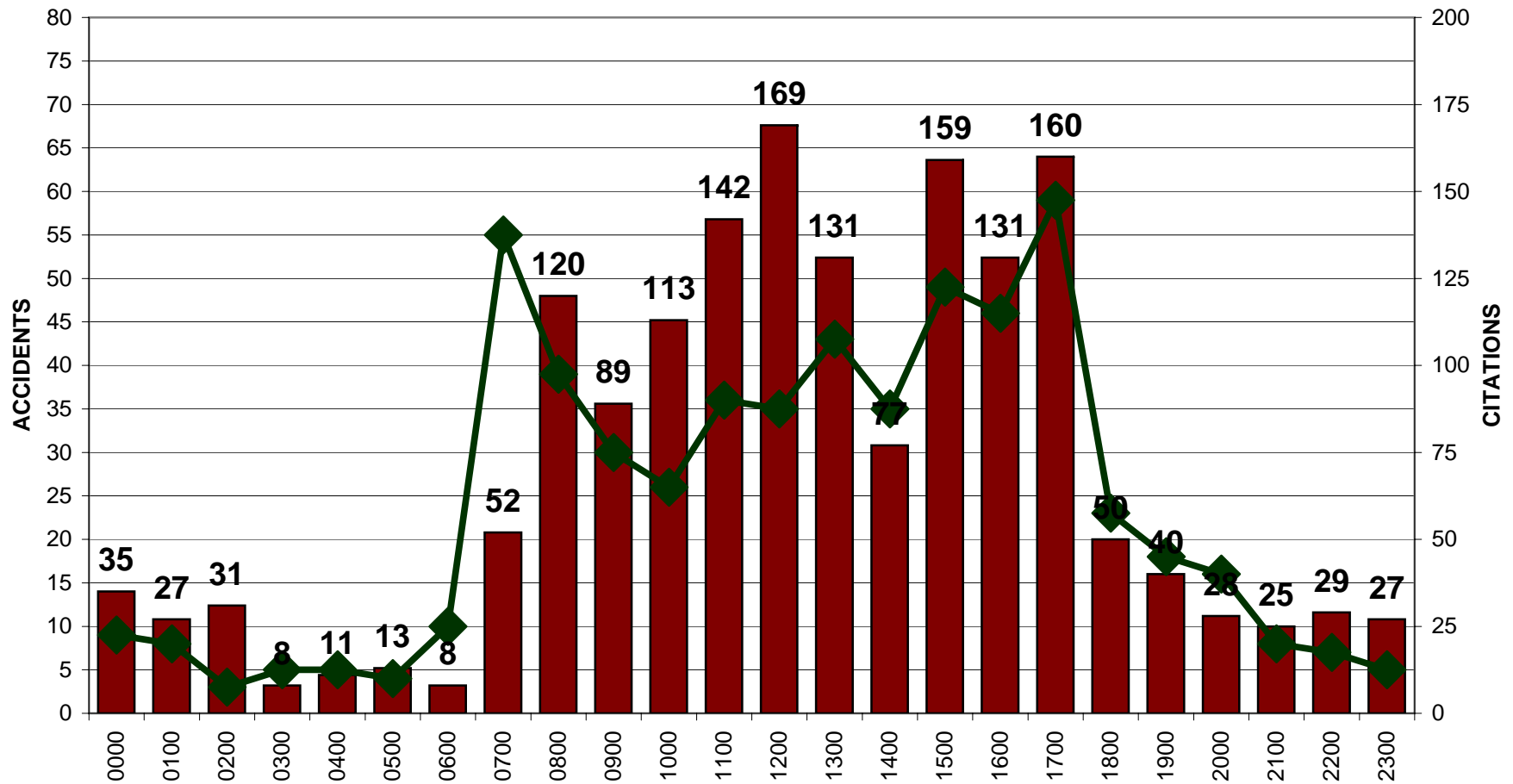

ACCIDENTS & CITATIONS BY HOUR

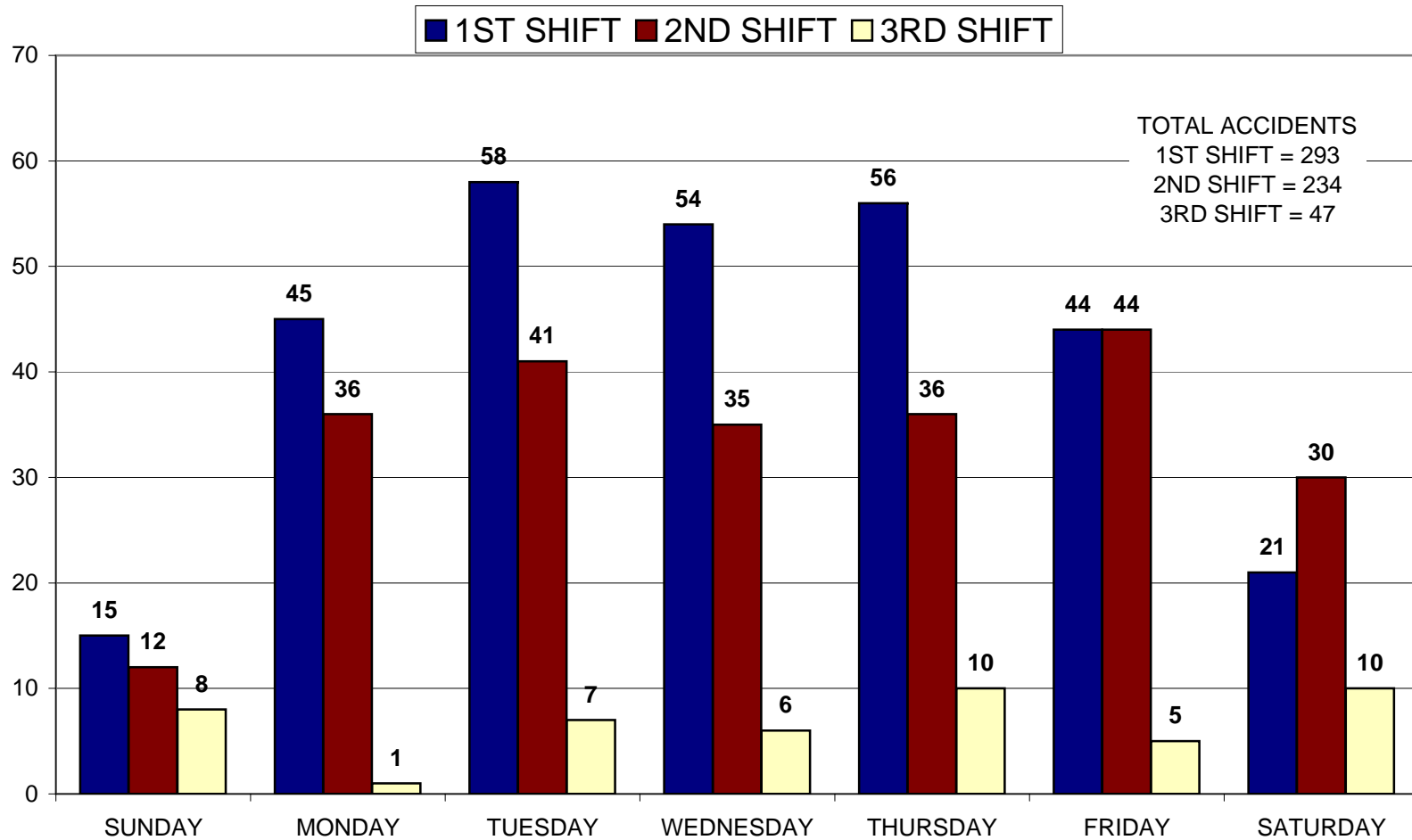
JANUARY 1 THRU SEPTEMBER 30, 2006

WORKLOAD ANALYSIS REPORT

January – September 2006

The January through September 2006 Workload Analysis reflects a total of 19,680 calls for service. This figure does not include traffic stops, foot patrols or courtesy cards initiated by officers or activity occurring in District 0 (calls outside city limits/mutual aid). The average response time for calls was five (5) minutes from the time the call was received by our communications technician until the first responding officer arrived on the scene. The average time to reach a disposition and clear the call was twenty-one (21) minutes.

The Workload Analysis also allows us to track activity levels by hour by day. We analyze this data to determine our staffing levels for patrol shifts. By reviewing our Workload Analysis Graph on the following page, you can see that our busiest hour of activity was between 3:00 PM and 4:00 PM. Two thousand two hundred sixty (2,260) calls for service were received during this time frame. The next busiest hour was between 4:00 PM and 5:00 PM when, 1,809 calls for service were received. The ability to obtain this type of data is critical to effectively staff our patrol shifts.

While reviewing this report it is important to note that various factors can influence average response times. "Stacking" of calls where lower priority calls are held so that calls of a more urgent nature can be dispatched and responded to commonly occurs. "Cross dispatching" where an officer is dispatched out of district to a call will also increase response time. Low priority calls that are received during roll call/shift change negate an immediate response from patrol officers thus increasing response times.

As a matter of practice, we like to keep our average response time for all calls occurring inside the City under ten (10) minutes. As previously stated, there are certain incidents where that becomes impossible. However, our goal is realistic and as demonstrated by the January through June 2006 report, was met. The following is a break down of calls for service by district with the overall total calls, average response time and average time to resolve the call:
