My First Camp (3-5 yrs)

My First Camp is a program for our youngest campers that incorporates age appropriate arts & crafts, outdoor education, and sports & games. Campers must be potty trained. Please note that campers WILL go outside to play.

Kidzone Combo (5-12 yrs)

Kidzone Combo is a great introduction to summer camp for families who do not need extended care hours or who are not quite ready to send their children on swimming or field trips. Campers will have a well-rounded and complete experience each day including age appropriate arts & crafts, outdoor education, and sports & games plus a special activity each Friday. Kidzone Combo DOES NOT go swimming or take field trips. Please note that campers WILL go outside to play.

Wyandot Camp (6-12 yrs)

Wyandot Camp is a program for children and families ready for a full-time camp experience. Campers are assigned to a group and a counselor each Monday and travel with that group learning the importance of teamwork and building camaraderie throughout the week. Activities often take the entire week to complete (for instance, a clay pot will be designed and put together one day, dry for another day, and painted at the end of the week) and include age appropriate arts & crafts, outdoor education, and sports & games. Wyandot campers swim twice a week for two hours, take one field trip each week, and have a special guest teacher each week. Additionally, Wyandot campers participate in a special All-Camp activity each Friday that the campers prepare for throughout the week (for instance, a talent show, camp Olympics, giant birthday party, etc). Please note that campers WILL go outside to play.
