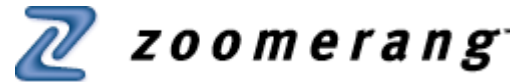

The only input given was on how to calm traffic on Tara Hill after Council screwed it up with the closing of Post Road, and that input should have been tempered with some common sense.
