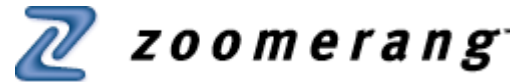

#	Response
1	More family oriented sit down restaurants need to be brought to "this side of the river"..there is very little in the Avery/Muirfield area to choose from. The city needs to help these restaurants succeed by reducing stringent rules on signage and other asthetics to help these businesses get up and running ex: the place that used to be next to Giant Eagle that had healthy fresh food and was really good, the young guy who started it couldn't get any business because his sign wasn't visable - because there HAD to be a TREE planted in front of the shop - so he failed and had to close.... Also, I see comparable cities like Springboro, OH with exceptional growth and businesses coming in - various eateries, etc. Everytime I'm there, I come back to Dublin disappointed that we don't have some of the same offerings for such a progressive town...
2	Add bike paths along the Scioto River, fix up the dead areas in the Dublin Village Center - make that place like the shops you see in Dublin, Ireland and Galway, Ireland!!! And most importantly, PRESERVE THE HISTORY OF DUBLIN - we can thrive economically on HISTORY and Ireland!

I have tried many times to register for the programs that run over the course of several weeks as a way around this. The only time I have been successful in getting into the class is by logging in the very minute registration opens. (BTW: When I actually got into that class, there was not

	adequate space in the Rec Center for it and at least one class night each week, we met in a stairwell!!) There is not adequate space or number of sections for adult fitness. The second issue I have relates to all day kindergarten in Dublin. The district waited too long to tell parents that it would apply for a waiver to get out of complying with the state mandates. (Parents need time to plan - and budget. The Superintendent whined in the Dublin News about how costly this will be for the city to implement, however, Dublin's delay will cost our family more than \$12,000 next year.) My guess is that you will not be refunding the taxes we pay for schools - regardless of the fact that our child cannot participate in kindergarten in our community. I realize that there will be the half day option, but have been told that not only are there more children than spots for after-school care, we can ONLY do before school OR after school care NOT both. Ironically, I believe that both my frustrations with the Recreation Center and the school district are rooted in the fact Dublin still is not in tune with the need of families in which both parents work outside the home.
